### **Reverend Dr John Moses**

Dr John Moses received his BA (honours) in History at the University of Queensland (UQ). He completed post-graduate studies at Universities of Munich and Erlangen in Germany. In 1966 he joined the staff of the Dept. of History at UQ as Researcher/Lecturer til 1984.

He published widely on German trade union history, the debates about the origin of the First World War and German colonialism in the Pacific.
